

BULGARIA – ANCIENT CIVILIZATION

Prehistory: "The earliest evidence of hominid occupation discovered in what is today Bulgaria date from at least 1.4 million years ago. 11 The earliest human remains found in Bulgaria were excavated in the Kozarnika cave, with an approximate age of 1,6 million BC. This cave probably keeps the earliest evidence of human symbolic behaviour ever found.

Around 5000 BC, a sophisticated civilization already existed which produced some of the first pottery, jewellery and golden artifacts in the world."



Some of the earliest evidence of <u>grape</u> cultivation and livestock <u>domestication</u> is associated with the Bronze Age <u>Ezero culture</u>. The <u>Magura Cave</u> drawings date from the same era.

BULGARIA – GLAGOLIC AND CYRILIC ALPHABET


In the early 9th century, a new alphabet

— <u>Cyrillic</u> — was developed at the Preslav

Literary School, adapted from the <u>Glagolitic</u>

<u>alphabet</u> (<u>855-862</u>) invented by the Bulgarian
brothers <u>Saints Cyril and Methodius</u>. [48]

The Cyrillic alphabet is an alphabet that turns Bulgaria into a pioneer, and the Bulgarian language into the basis of all Slavic languages.

Beginning of the 19th century

Small communities with strong patriarchate model; the priest, teacher, mayor

Monastery cell. Adolescents sit on mats on the ground. A priest teaches them the alphabet, then to spell, very rarely - and to count. Everyone studies the church books -Apostle, Psalter and Hours. It is considered a higher science if all three are studied.



At the same time, some European universities are already at the enviable age of 500-600 years.





19th century

The school was an unattractive place for literacy. There were no trained teachers, often random people became such.

The teacher taught his students only what he himself had learned with great difficulty.

- Lack in pedagogical skills
 - lack of scientific matter

"The belief that the rod is a tree of paradise, it fixes everyone and everything, parents and teachers said."







First Bulgarian School in Varna: 1861

Initiated and financed by a prominent public figure and merchant.

The first teacher - Sava Dobroplodni - a famous poet, public figure, playwright and educator.







20th century

The **People's Republic of Bulgaria** - Socialist republic

- a <u>socialist republic</u> from 1946 to 1990, ruled by the <u>Bulgarian</u> <u>Communist Party</u>





- lack of people, lack of prepared people




