- Indicator 3: Net enrollment rate in primary education.
- Indicator 4: Percentage of students enrolled in NGS

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

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


Graph 2: Social segregation and freedom of education





5. Conclusions and discussion

- It is important to associate the concept of freedom of education to the <u>generalized</u> access <u>of all</u> <u>types of families to NGS</u>.
- The association of freedom of education <u>with developing countries and poor institutional</u> <u>framework must be rejected.</u>
- There is <u>ample room for improvement</u> in freedom of education in all regions/countries.
- The association between freedom of education and school segregation/inequality <u>is not verified.</u>
- Today, <u>combating economic inequalities</u> and fostering social mobility are high on the political agenda in the West. <u>Educational reforms</u> that increase freedom can be a powerful tool.
